



ADDITIONAL GUIDELINES

CITY OF VIRGINIA BEACH COVID-19 PHASE ONE BEACH OPENING - OPERATING PROCEDURES

JUNE 2020

In addition to the requirements, procedures, and measures in the City of Virginia Beach COVID-19 Beach Opening Operating Procedures, May 2020, the City of Virginia must comply with the following:

- Clean teams should be assigned to work in all zones.
- Post signage at all public access points to the beaches, parking lots and garages, elevators, and other “cluster prone” areas providing public health reminders regarding physical distancing, gatherings, options for high risk individuals, and staying home if sick. Messaging must be specific to location, e.g., reminding beachgoers to not crowd elevators and limit capacity to persons arriving together or maintaining social distancing.
- High touch surfaces made of plastic or metal, such as railings, benches, crosswalks and elevator buttons, and shower stand touch points, must be cleaned at a minimum of every two hours.
- It is recommended that disinfectant-level cleaning of all public restrooms of every two hours with an EPA-approved disinfectant and that cleaning staff be trained and follow [CDC guidance on cleaning and disinfecting](#).
- Recommend that vendors be required to set up beach umbrellas and chairs for customers and that vendors be required to separate umbrellas and chairs of each group by six feet of distance. Vendors must be required to clean equipment between rentals. Vendors must follow [EPA guidelines](#) and [CDC guidelines](#) on cleaning and disinfecting.
- All common areas that encourage gathering must remain closed such as pavilions, gazebos, and picnic areas.
- The City of Virginia Beach must provide daily metrics to the Virginia Beach Health Department to include beach closures, complaint incidents, police reports of violence related to enforcement, and number of reports of noncompliance of Amended Executive

Order 61 and Amended Order of Public Health Emergency Three to be submitted each Monday, by close of business until Amended Executive Order 61 and Order of Public Health Emergency Three expires or is otherwise rescinded or amended by further order.

- All employees or contract workers implementing the Phase One Beach Opening Operating Procedures should wear a cloth face covering when not able to practice physical distancing following [CDC Use of Face Cloth Coverings guidance](#).
- Employees or contract workers implementing the Phase One Beach Opening Operating Procedures should have access to soap and water or hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol. Provide best hygiene practices to employees on a regular basis, including washing hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and practicing respiratory etiquette protocols. - The City of Virginia Beach shall require all employees involved in implementing the Phase One Beach Opening Operating Procedures to take their temperature before reporting to work and direct such employees not report to work if they have a fever of over 100.4 degrees, have experienced chills, or have been feverish in the last 72 hours. The City shall also require all contractors providing workers to implement the Phase One Beach Opening Operating Plan to employ equivalent measures.
