The Needs of Our Students

Petersburg students face an average of **23 weeks** of learning loss in math and **21 weeks** of learning loss in reading due to the COVID-19 pandemic

The average chronic absenteeism rate for Petersburg students is **2.5x** higher than the statewide average



Expanding Health Department Clinic Hours

Initiative Summary:

Expand access to the Petersburg Health Department to expand the services for the citizens of Petersburg.

To address the specific health needs of the citizens, services and hours for screenings are being expanded to ensure that needed critical preventive and screening services are offered.







Providing Mobile Health Care Clinics

Initiative Summary:

Provide mobile health care clinics to improve access to critical health screenings and preventive care.

Mobile care clinics will serve as a vital link between the community and existing community partners and existing health providers, while also offering more tailored and consistent access to health care services for Petersburg residents.





Establishing Community-Based Health Literacy "Hubs"

Initiative Summary:

Collaborate with community partners (Central Virginia Health Services, Bon Secours Southside Regional, and DMAS' Managed Care Organizations) to establish health literacy "hubs."

Leveraging community partners to foster greater health literacy will increase awareness, utilization of primary care services, prenatal care services and will reduce health disparities.







Poor Creek Water Improvement

Initiative Summary:

Collaborate with Dept. of Environmental Quality, Virginia Department of Health and local leadership to facilitate the swift upgrades for water and wastewater infrastructure at Poor Creek Pump Station.

These improvements will provide improved, reliable service to current customers and support future residential and commercial development in the Poor Creek area.

Early Impact Underway

- Shootings down 12%
- Aggravated Assaults nearly cut in half decreased 48%
- Murders reduced by more than half decreased 56%
- 24 juveniles detained for crimes involving firearms

Through the Ceasefire Program, we will be bringing Group Violence Intervention Coordinators to the region, and more federal prosecutors for the Eastern District of Virginia in order to hold criminals accountable.

- \$8 million to construct the Multimodal Center
- \$10 million to make Petersburg Station platform improvements and address ADA and state-of-goodrepair deficiencies
- \$58 million to NC and VA to improve rail travel between Richmond and Raleigh, including Petersburg These investments along with the study of the I-95 and I-85 exits including Washington and Wythe Streets and transit improvements open the door for future infrastructure investment in Petersburg

Additional Passenger Rail Service

Initiative Summary:

We are launching a third roundtrip train from Washington DC to Norfolk which will add additional trains through Petersburg to provide high-quality multimodal options for Petersburg residents to access economic hubs within the Commonwealth and along the East Coast.

Advance the Richmond-to-Raleigh Train Corridor through Petersburg

Initiative Summary:

North Carolina and Virginia recently won \$58 million to advance rail improvements between Richmond and Raleigh which, when the project is complete, will make train travel competitive with car travel between the two economic hubs. This will directly benefit Petersburg with additional train options and faster trip times.

Ensure Petersburg has Safe Entrances and Exits along the I-95 and I-85 Corridors

Initiative Summary:

The Virginia Department of Transportation will assess appropriate infrastructure improvements in Petersburg in areas along the I-95 and I-85 corridors including Exit 52, Washington and Wythe Streets and make recommendations for safety and operational improvements.
